FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, JACK COREY

Dear Parishioners:

To be honest, sometimes I have to remind myself how blessed I am. As a principal, it is my job to make sure we are continually working to become better. In my search for areas needing improvement, I can become overly critical. At times like these I need to step back a moment to view the overall picture like I did while preparing for our first teacher in-service and was very happy with what I saw.

We have been working to improve our math program. While working with our 8th grade scores from last year, I saw our AVERAGE math students were scoring significantly higher than most 11th graders across the nation on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test.

This was significant for me because our teachers chose our math program as a building focus for improvement over the last three years and it is paying off. Our students are leaving our school better prepared than students in other schools and are scoring even higher than our students in previous years.

Does that mean our work is done? Not even close! It just means our efforts are paying off and our students are the beneficiaries of this effort. Opening school gets me rather excited, as we roll up our sleeves and set out to improve the work we do.
