### Seasonal Changes and Our Life in Christ

The month of November always gives a preview of new things to come. The natural environment changes: the climate begins to get cold, the trees shed their leaves, and the winds with wings spread out and sweep down on us with whispering sound and people dig out their heavy jackets to ready themselves for the winter. All these events give us an opportunity to pause! The changing phases of the natural environment are indicative that nature is alive and dynamic, and it is vivified and sustained by the spirit of Christ.

While we experience these natural phenomena, the Church also helps us understand what is going on around us. The month of November opens for us a door into the life of God among us. We celebrate the Feast of All Saints to remind ourselves of our communion with the saints in heaven. The feast of All Souls also gives a chance to celebrate the new life of our loved ones who have stepped beyond the earthly threshold to embrace a new life in Christ. These two events demonstrate to us that we are not alone and that our work here on earth is not in vain.

Further, the month of November is a gateway to the celebration of "Thanksgiving" to express our gratitude to God for all his blessings on us, while at the same time we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord's birth which is the season of Advent and Christmas. All these celebrations and the changes in the natural environment should urge us also to renew ourselves not only exteriorly but also interiorly.

As the days draw closer to December and get shorter and shorter with darkness overshadowing and engulfing our environment, we liken ourselves to the gestation period of a child. It is a period of allowing ourselves to be nourished and nurtured by the Word of God so that we can be enriched for the celebration of the new life at Christmas. Let us therefore use this period of fall to gestate feeding on the Word of God.

Additionally, the Word of God that nourishes us also reveals to us our dependence on God. It helps us understand that these changing phases of nature constantly impel us to renew ourselves in the spirit of Christ, for his Spirit molds and refashions us to meet his demands of love, compassion, and mercy. Let us therefore respond to the changing environment with newness of spirit so that we can celebrate our lives with mind and heart transformed to take care of the poor and the sick in our midst. Remember, you are the face of Christ!
