THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The first reading of last Sunday from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel spoke about the River in the temple of the Lord. It concluded with the following: *"Along the bank of the river, on this side and that will grow all kinds of trees used for food; their leaves will not wither, and their fruit will not fail. They will bear fruit every month, because their water flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food and their leaves for medicine."* (Ez. 47:1-12). Ezekiel's vision points us to what was mentioned in the Book of Proverbs: *"The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death."* (Prov. 14: 27). For those who believe in God, He is the fountain of their life. The people in the Old Testament were constantly reminded that God was their ground of existence. Life is derived from Him and without Him, there is no life.

In the New Testament, Jesus comes to us as the "Fountain of life," the perfect revelation of God who sustains and vivifies creation. And so Jesus cries out to us: *"Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink."* As the scripture has said, *'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water'* (John 7: 37-39). In other words, those who anchor their life in Jesus will never see their life parched and desolate. As the foundation of our existence, we derive from Him our very sustenance. His life flows within us like a fountain of love, mercy, compassion, peace, and love. As our fountain of life, He cleanses us through baptism, and confirms us through the sacrament of confirmation, maintains and nourishes us through the Word and the Eucharist, showers His gifts on us through the power of the Holy Spirit. He simply offers Himself to us because He knows that ordinary water only quenches our thirst momentarily but His life in and for us is eternal.

Thus, He has transformed us into extraordinary people who bear the gifts of God. YOU are an extraordinary person! In you the fountain of life is flowing. You are no more the "old" person but transformed into Living water that flows and nourishes those who are wandering and groping in the desert of life. Your gifts are sufficient to enrich their parched life. Be the Fountain of Life for your neighbor. Allow the Spirit of God to fertilize, nourish and nurture you so that you can extend this great gift of God to others. Share your life of Living water with others. In your spare time read the following passage from the Prophet Isaiah: *"Ho! Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters ..."* Isaiah 55:1-3.
