Things I've Seen and Heard

Last weekend did not turn out how I had planned or hoped. I was scheduled for two weddings at St. Ignatius (left over from my time there), and the full complement of Sunday Masses here at St. Antoninus. On Wednesday, June 3rd, I started experiencing some very strong chest pains, and I went to the emergency room at Good Sam Hospital to get checked out. I was admitted to the hospital, and had a number of cardiac tests performed as the doctors and nurses tried to nail down what was going on. As a result, I needed to get substitute help for the Sunday Masses just in case my stay lasted through the weekend. Therefore, I wish to thank Deacon Bob, Beth Bollin, and Julie Scott for helping me, and making very quick arrangements for the substitute priests that were here with us last weekend. The medical staff at Good Sam were able to determine that I did not suffer a heart attack, but it sure did feel like one. My heart actually checked out fine, and all the tests came back normal, and no blockages were found at all. The medical folks at the hospital believe that it may have been caused by high stress, as well as acid reflux, and this could well be the case. There was certainly enough happening that week, and the two previous that were big sources of stress. This episode certainly is a reminder to me not only of my mortality, but also of my humanity, and that, as just one man, I cannot do everything, be everywhere, or meet every expectation placed upon me by others, or myself. The medical folks have asked me to take things at a slower pace, to reduce the stress. This I will do, for myself and my own health, but also for all of you. My own self-care is something I owe to all of you, so that I am able to be the best pastor I can be for you. I was discharged from the hospital before the weekend, but the parish staff felt it would be better if I had only one Sunday Mass rather than three, so I only had the 11:30 AM last weekend. This weekend, things should be back to normal. Thank you all for your continued prayers, which did, and do make a difference. May God continue to shower His blessings on us here at St. A.
