nesday, September 27, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, will launch a two-year campaign from Saint Peter's Square, and invite everyone around the world to "Share the Journey" with migrants and refugees. Following is a number of frequently asked questions regarding this two-year campaign.

What is the Share the Journey campaign? Share the Journey has, at its heart, the vision of a more united and fraternal human family. Our focus is on our joint journey as people on the move in departing and host communities. Our public awareness campaign promotes opportunities and ways for individuals, groups and communities to come together and share stories and experiences with those who are on the move, strengthening the bonds between migrants and communities. Who is running the campaign? Caritas Internationalis is running the campaign. Caritas is a global confederation of 165 national Caritas organizations in 113 countries. Caritas is the charitable arm of the Catholic Church, and the confederation works at the diocesan, national, regional and international levels on issues such as poverty, migration, social justice, climate change, hunger, health and emergencies. How is Pope Francis involved? Pope Francis will launch the campaign from Saint Peter's Square on September 27th, 2017. On that day, he will invite everyone around the world to "Share the Journey" with refugees and migrants. Why is this important? The campaign? Pope Francis has made numerous appeals to promote the culture of encounter, in an effort to combat the culture of indifference in the world today. It means seeing the world through the eyes of others rather than turning a blind eye. "Not just to see but to look. Not just to see but to listen. Not just to meet and pass by but to stop. And don't just say, 'what a shame', but allow ourselves to be moved by pity." – Pope Francis. How long will the campaign last? The campaign starts on September 27th, 2017 and runs until September 27th, 2019. Who is involved? All Caritas member organizations are invited to promote the campaign at the national level by organizing events and activities. Bishops' conferences and faith-based organizations are invited to share our materials with their audiences. What change do we want to see? We want to contribute to the building of stronger communities and more inclusive societies. What does the campaign promote? The campaign promotes "the culture of encounter". We aim to increase the spaces and opportunities for migrants and communities to come together, and learn about each other. Who can join the campaign? Anyone who is interested can join the campaign. We invite, in particular, people who have the experience of migration who can be invited to share their journey, whether they are migrants or people in communities affected by migration. Why should I join the campaign? If you are passionate about migration and interested in what is happening in our world, then this is a campaign where you can make a difference at all levels. This is an opportunity to share something of yourself and to offer it up in friendship in exchange for friendship and a journey of discovery. How can I get involved? You can organize an event in your community. You can pray. You can write to your government on migration. You can share our materials on social media and take a "Share the Journey" photo in support of the campaign, and share on your social media accounts. How can I get involved? You can get involved in migration projects through your diocesan or national Caritas. What resources are available for campaign supporters? Our campaign action guide will help you mobilize your resources at the school or your parish. 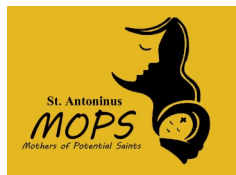

an 55:6-9: This passage from Isaiah comes from a part of the book that is known as the banquet of the Lord's Covenant. The Israelites are called to conversion. In order to be found, they must return to God ("seek the Lord while He may be found). The Lord is merciful and who does not judge in the way that men do, is willing and able to grant the call to repentance is grounded on the goodness of God who "will abundantly pardon" who would grasp the opportunity that God offers him.

Psalm: Psalm 145: 2-3, 8-9, 17-18: This psalm is a psalm of David, in which we praise the Lord, for He is great and merciful, and His kingdom endures forever. The Lord's justice, in the sense that He responds with kindness and salvation to all who invoke His name. In verse 2, the words "every day" probably refer to Morning Prayer at the beginning of the day. The words "great and merciful", in verse 8, are a partial quotation of Exodus 34:6-7 that serves as a reminder of God's mercy. In verse 18, the psalmist shares his confidence, that God desires to help and answer the prayers of His people.

Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a: The letter to the Philippians is one of four of St. Paul's letters to churches, because they were written when the apostle was in prison. Philippi was a city in St. Paul's time, and the church of Philippi was the first to be founded by Paul on his missionary journey. The Acts of the Apostles give a fairly detailed account of his visit to Philippi, with St. Paul stating, "Christ will be magnified in my body....", by which the apostle meant that he had united to Christ through baptism, and this union is strengthened by the Eucharist. The apostle would aspire to identify with Jesus, to such an extent, that he or she can say, along with St. Paul, "I am no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me". Paul will undergo many hardships for the Gospel, but he tells us that he would only be put to shame if he denied Christ. He extols the Gospel as the power of God, worthy of the Gospel.

Matthew 20: 1-16a: Matthew chapter 20 follows Jesus, as He continues to head for Jerusalem, south along the eastern side of the Jordan and will finally cross the river near Jericho, toward the holy city. As Jesus travels on, He offers another parable of the kingdom of God to His disciples on the egalitarian household structures shaped by God's empire. The parable contrasts the landowner's picture of God's empire. The setting of the parable alternates between a vineyard and a village marketplace. The image of a vineyard tended by a landowner is a common image in the Old Testament that depicts the Lord cultivating and caring for His people. The parable takes place over the traditional workday, from sunrise to sunset, and the landowner offers wages at the usual daily wage. As we see in the text, workers are hired (approximately every hour) throughout the day from the marketplace; a common practice in Jesus' day. The workers hired at the end of the day receive the usual daily wage." The availability of workers through the day suggests that Jewish law required that hired help be paid by sundown at the end of each day.
