Recently I attended the St. Lawrence deanery meeting, and one of the topics that was discussed was priest coverage of the new Mercy Hospital on North Bend Road. During the discussion, the priests were reminded that because of the HIPPA privacy laws, the hospitals no longer call the parishes to notify them when parishioners check into the hospital. Over the years, this has caused some problems with missing people in the hospital, simply because the parish was never notified, because of HIPPA. The priests do want to make sure that everyone who wants to be visited in the hospital, and who wants to receive the Sacraments is able to receive them. If you, or someone you know is ever admitted to the hospital, you are highly encouraged to contact the parish to let us know, because we can no longer expect the hospitals to call.
