FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. CHRISTOPHER R. ARMSTRONG

Perhaps, you have heard the phrase: "that's it in a nutshell." Well, I would like to paraphrase that and say: "that's it in an avocado pit." Let me explain. In the summer of 2004, I traveled to California for the 50th anniversary of priestly ordination of my spiritual father, Dom Bernard Johnson, O.S.C.O. Among other things, I ate an avocado and kept its pit, which, when I had returned home, I poked with toothpicks and balanced on a glass of water. I had done that a few times before. Only once before did one of my attempts strike root; it grew a few leaves, then died. But this time not only did the avocado pit strike root, it flourished and sits proudly in our back parlor, nearly five feet tall, bark and all. I mention it, because it seems to me to be a living parable of my time here at St. Antoninus as your pastor. It has been a time of growth for me in more ways than I can express here and I give thanks to the Lord and to you for the room to grow as a person, a priest and a pastor. But the avocado's new growth also suggests hopes and dreams for the future. My hopes and dreams for the future of our parish are three-fold: 1) that we be a truly welcoming and evangelizing parish; 2) that small groups of every kind take root and flourish because they are consistently proven to be a great help in spiritual growth; 3) that each one of our parishioners is asked to do what he or she does best, per Living Your Strengths, as means of personal growth and of service to others. May Our Lady, Undoer of Knots, pray for us and our parish!

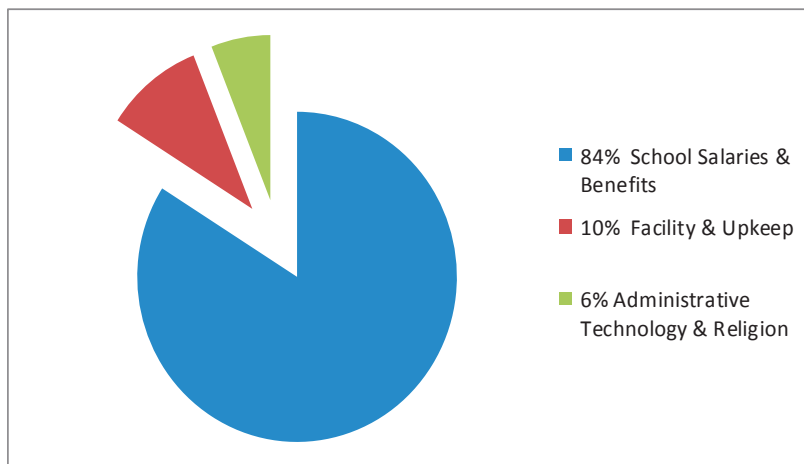

Further Budget Discussion:

Approximate Weekly Budgeted Collection to fund operating expenses and capital improvements = \$26,540.

Every school child received a tuition reduction from our parish income. Please continue to support our Kroger, Remke and Gift Card Program and the Main-A-Vent.

NOTE: Interest income from notes held at the Archdiocese continues to decline. Our current rate is 2.5%, but will be reduced again in September, 2014. Similarly, interest on our Endowment fund will also decrease, both contributing to our overall loss in net revenue.
