Knowing Christ

The last four weeks' readings have been about God's mercy for us. One may ask what is God's mercy? It is God's love revealed in Jesus Christ. This revelation is well spelt out in the letter to the Hebrews that Jesus revealed God's mercy to us through tears of supplication and offering prayers for us to the point of offering himself on the cross for our redemption. All of us, therefore, have been redeemed by Christ through his once and for all sacrifice. Through his death, we all have deserved God's mercy. It is because of this fact that we are able to cry out for mercy from God. God's mercy is love; it is compassion; it is justice, and above all it is the peace we all seek. Because God shows us his mercy in Christ, we are also called upon to show mercy to one another. It is to be shared because it is a gift of God. We cannot keep the gift to ourselves. A gift must be given to remain a gift.

Christ's mercy, therefore, must be shared in our community and then be extended to those outside our community. The hallmark that differentiates us—as a community of believers—from others, is our ability to demonstrate our gifts of mercy, love and compassion so that others can learn from us. As we begin to prepare for the celebration of Thanksgiving in November, let us remember those who need our attention and gifts, and share our gifts with them. It is how we know that Christ lives within us! Share Him with others.
