Dear Pilgrims,

Since I am writing to you after I left office as pastor, I had been asked to put into the St. Antoninus bulletin a homily I preached on September 21, "Hopes and Dreams." I have committed myself to say the rosary every day for "our" parish.

September 20/21 25th Sunday St. Antoninus

Some of you may remember Arleene Vallejos who was a 2nd grade teacher in our parish school for 43 years and retired this past June. When we held programs for the parents of our First Communicants, Arleene would speak of "Hopes and Dreams". She would hold up the sheets of paper and then tell the parents she would be after them until they did it. Then she told a moving story of her own mother who died a few months after childbirth, Arleene's birth. Her mother wrote to her father away in the army and said how she hoped the baby girl will grow up and the dreams she had for her, the dreams, it seems, every mother has for her child. Arleene ended by saying how precious those letters were to her.

Well, I have my hopes and dreams for our parish as I leave. Let me explain. What I have in my hand is an avocado pit. About ten years ago I planted a similar pit and that tree resulted. I am still amazed by it and for me it is an image of the three things I would like to see grow in our parish after I leave.

The first hope and dream is that we are a welcoming and evangelizing parish. Welcome. Recently I saw a former parishioner who had moved out of the parish, just as I came (not sure of the connection!) Before she left to move, she asked if she could come back and be buried from here. When I saw her, I reminded her of her request and before I could tell her I was moving she said: "Not anymore. When I walked into that church I felt hugged". She was referring to that church's architecture but how much more each and every person who walks into our parish church needs to feel hugged, needs to feel truly welcomed.

Evangelize. As I have been packing I have come across lots of stuff. One item was this small pamphlet given to me by an Hispanic woman. I sat next to her as I flew to Rome to begin my theological studies on September 1, 1976. As we spoke she was amazed that Catholics are indeed Christians, who accept Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. She gave me this pamphlet, it summarizes the Christian message and she wrote her name, address and telephone number on it. I can't remember if I contacted her but 38 years later I remember her concern for my salvation. To be a welcoming and evangelizing parish means that people may not remember what we say but they will always remember how we make them feel. Their first step in being a welcoming and evangelizing parish means that everyone feels hugged, that they belong here, that we truly care about their salvation.

The second hope and dream is the formation and preservation of small groups. Look at someone whose faith and good example you admire. I am willing to bet my avocado tree that they either belong to a small group and/or have someone in their life with whom they deeply share their faith. What a great blessing it is to have your family as your small group and I am truly edified when I see families praying together, it help me get it together! If you look on the front page of our bulletin there are all kinds of small groups to join for faith-sharing and for doing good. It is still my fondest hope that Christ Renew His Parish -- especially for men- will once again be renewed in our parish.

The third hope and dream is Living Your Strengths, being asked to do what you do best. The strengths finder is not just about psychological improvement. It is about discovering our strengths and placing them at the serviced of others in the name of the Lord. We have had such groups meet for the Living Your Strengths journey. Those who have taken it, it seems to me, have become better equipped for ministry, for in the end, we are judged on what we did for the least of our brothers and sisters. In the evening of life, says St. John of the Cross, we will be judged on love.

So there you have it in a nutshell, or in this case, an avocado pit. Who would ever have guessed that tree would come out of this pit? Who would ever have hoped and dreamed that St. Antoninus be a welcoming and evangelizing parish—a parish formed of faith-filled small groups, living their strengths... and growing ever more into the likeness of the Risen Christ?
