A Community of Believers

Being a Christian in our world today is not an easy decision. There are so many attractions and distractions that serve as impediments to fulfilling the demands of Christianity. However, while it may not be easy in our time, so it was in the first centuries of Christianity and it has continued till our time. In our period, we are surrounded by technology that facilitates our knowledge of Christ and at the same time detracts at times from understanding Christ. The good thing however is that we have a community, our church community. That is our home where we can feel and know that we are different. Within the community of believers, our sense of belonging takes root, and gives us a sense of grounding. Within the community, we experience the presence of Christ. It is His love that binds the community together. Thus, all those who belong to the community are bound together in love. Thus St. Paul in his letter to the Galatians would write: *“There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus”* (Gal. 3:28). In Christ, we have been made into a new creation and been given a new meaning of life. Our new life impels us to live like Christ, demonstrating His gifts that are part of the new life. Your life and my life are intertwined in the life of Christ so bound together, that, when one member of the community suffers, all the members in the community suffer. This is the meaning of the community we call the “the people of God.”

In this community, Christ lives and moves. His presence makes the community distinct and the distinction is characterized by the gifts we bear: love, compassion, mercy, forgiveness, generosity, peace, justice, etc. We all bear these numerous gifts and we are to make use of these gifts, without reservation, in the measure that we have been given. Ask the Holy Spirit, then to help you discover these gifts so that you can use them to build the church community at St. Antoninus.




“CLEAN-UP the LEAVES DAYS”
