OUR LORD CHRIST THE KING

In the past three weeks, I have painstakingly deliberated on the gifts God has given to each of us for the edification of the body of Christ. We all received the gifts during the reception of the sacraments of baptism and confirmation. These gifts are wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord (wonder and awe) (1Cor. 12:11). The purpose of the gifts is to dispose the Christian to work harder with the cooperation of the Holy Spirit and minister to ourselves in order to attune our minds and hearts to the promptings of the Spirit so that we can build up each other to exercise the virtues of life. Thus, St. Thomas Aquinas, a brilliant theologian of the church once wrote that the gift of wisdom corresponds to the virtue of charity, understanding and knowledge correspond to the virtue of faith, counsel (right judgment) corresponds to the virtue of prudence, fortitude corresponds to the virtue of courage, fear of the Lord corresponds to the virtue of hope, Piety (Reverence) corresponds to the virtue of justice.

In order to discover these gifts and their corresponding virtues, we must listen and allow ourselves to be guided by the Holy Spirit that dwells within us. The Spirit guides us to work to produce the fruits of the gifts: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. We all need the gifts to edify ourselves and help others. We need the gifts to work and produce their fruits so that we can build a healthy relationship with others and create a healthy environment for ourselves, our children, our communities, our nation, and the world. For the Christian, it is imperative to allow the Holy Spirit to prompt you to explore and discover the immeasurable benefits of the gifts and their fruits. Exploring the gift of wisdom to discover charity (love at its best) is the most significant pursuit you can undertake; exploring the gift of understanding God's Word to gain knowledge of God is the best thing a Christian can gain; exploring the gift of counsel to deepen one's manner of making judgments about situations and other people is being prudent, a rare virtue that is missing in our world; pursuing the gift of fortitude to gather courage to hope for a better future that can lead to reverence for the virtue of justice is godly!

Let us therefore, as a community imbued with a sense of faith in God, turn to each other and say "I love you because you are God's gift to me. In you, I see the face of God." Let the Spirit be re-enchanted in you to discover the tremendous gifts of God. Stay blessed!
