We have once again entered the Season of Ordinary Time. The Christmas Trees and Christmas Lights are gone, and so is the Manger Scene. The exquisite beauty of the church to which we were treated during the Christmas Season is now being replaced with the beauty of Ordinary Time. I am sorry to see the Christmas decorations go, because they always bring me great joy and comfort. The Christmas Season here at St. Antoninus was extraordinary, and I feel that we all did great justice to the Season, that our focus was on Christ, and not just the cute little baby in the crib, but on the Son of God, the Divine Person who came in human flesh to set us free from sin and death. Christmas is now over, and the business of the day to day of our lives is back in full swing. We are now in our “Ordinary Time”, our ordinary routines.

### DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF THE UNBORN

Thursday, January 22, 2015 marks the beginning of the 42<sup>nd</sup> year of legalized abortion in the United States. It is the anniversary of the infamous Roe vs. Wade decision of the Supreme Court of the United States which, in effect, legalized abortion in all fifty states. The bishops of the United States have asked that this date be a day of prayer and sacrifice in reparation for the sin of the intentional killing of unborn children, to pray the victims of abortion, and to pray for the legal protection of the unborn. To that end, you are invited to participate in a memorial prayer vigil to be held at Planned Parenthood at 2314 Auburn Ave., from Noon to 1:00pm. Also, Deacon Schroeder will lead a holy hour at **7:00pm** in the **Fr. Goeckler Chapel at St. Antoninus Church**. This will be an hour of adoration of the Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary and Benediction.

Dear Parishioners,

Last year during registration we filled our all-kindergarten class in one day. This year, I am predicting we will do the same. With this in mind, we have developed a policy to establish a preference for acceptance. Children already enrolled at St. Antoninus Parish School shall have first priority in registration and acceptance for the following year provided they register at the designated time. Any available places will then be filled in the following order:

- ◆ Children who have siblings already enrolled at St. Antoninus Parish School.
- ◆ Children of parishioners whose older children attended St. Antoninus Parish School.
- ◆ The first child of a parishioner.
- ◆ The above being equal, the family which has been in the parish the longest will prevail.

In the event that there are still openings after priority acceptance has been completed, registration will be accepted on a first come/first served basis.
