

Things I've Seen and Heard Musings of Fr. Bryan Reif

Last Saturday, St. Antoninus hosted the "Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic" seminar with Fr. Bob Sherry. I have to say that I was greatly impressed with this seminar, and with the presentation, and I believe that the Four Signs: Prayer, Study, Generosity, and Evangelization are great places to place focus for all of us, both as individuals as well as a parish community. I made this observation to Deacon Bob during the seminar: The anchor for all of this is the prayer piece. Prayer is the foundation, it is the gateway to having a relationship with the Lord, it is the means by which we come to know Him, love Him, and serve Him. Prayer leads the person to more openness to God's presence, and to God's grace in that person's life. The other four signs, Study, Generosity, and Evangelization, to my mind, are ways that the prayerful person responds to the Grace that God is giving.

Fr. Bob Sherry pointed out in his talk on prayer that this is the one thing that Jesus' disciples really asked him for: "Lord, teach us how to pray..." What is prayer? Have you, or I, ever really been taught "how" to pray? Sure, we have the prayers that we memorized in school, we know what to say before meals, we know what to say and do at Mass, but are we really praying, or just reciting words we have memorized? It is a good thing to know the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be, the Apostles Creed, and the responses to the prayers at Mass, and to faithfully say them. That is to be encouraged greatly. It is also important to engage the heart in prayer, and to converse with Jesus as we would with any other, sharing our day, our night, our joy, our pain, every aspect of our lives with Him. A great place to start with this, heart-filled conversational prayer, is to give thanks every day for something, for everything we have and are comes from God.

This seminar inspired me, and it taught me something. We need to strive for holiness, which necessarily means going beyond the minimums, and truly engaging prayer, in study, in generosity, and in evangelization. It means we need and are called to witness God's love and presence. Fr. Bob Sherry said "start small, and go incrementally." Rome wasn't built in a day, and holiness of life and intentional discipleship takes time, and especially takes grace. Prayer is the key, it's the place to start.
