## FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



### Things I've Seen and Heard, Musings of Fr. Bryan Reif

As we continue our journey through the Easter Season, there are a couple of events that I would like to talk about with you this week. The first is First Holy Communion. Our Second Grade school children and PREP children are in their final stages of formation to receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament for the first time next weekend. This is a very special, and a very holy time not only for our students, but for the whole St. Antoninus family, and indeed for the whole Church. Reflecting on this wonderful event, I think of the words of Jesus in the Bread of Life Discourse in John's Gospel: "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6:35) The Holy Eucharist is a precious gift from God to all of us. It is the gift of Himself, His Body, His Blood, so that we might have life in Him. We see hunger and thirst in many forms in our world, none more apparent to us than in a culture that hungers and thirsts for something greater, but often doesn't seem to know where to look. Jesus is the answer, and He gives Himself to us in the Eucharist so that we can find rest, refreshment, and content in Him. May God bless our second graders as they come forward to receive Our Lord in the Eucharist for the first time.

The next big event after First Communion is graduation. Our eighth grade students still have a month or so to go, to fulfill all the academic requirements needed for graduation. I am looking forward on that day to sending these fine young men and women off to high school. Please continue to pray for our eighth graders as they approach graduation, and as they embark upon a new stage and journey as they enter their high school years. May they never forget that while they may no longer go to school here, St. Antoninus is still home.
